have an email and/or a cell phone number, it allows us to send you
updates in real time. You can sign up to be informed of something
that affects the entire parish, such as a Mass cancellation, or
something that pertains to the groups to which you belong, such as:
we need lectors to volunteer for the holiday Mass. We are asking
everyone who has a cell phone number and an email to sign-up for
Flocknote. When you are ready to sign up on the site, make sure that
you select your parish and the groups under your parish. All three
parishes are listed on the site.

One of the best features about Flocknote is its usefulness for those
who minister in the parishes. Once you have signed up for your
ministry, you have the ability to text or email the other ministers,
asking if someone can cover for you. You don't have to go searching
for telephone numbers and start calling until you find a substitute.
You can ask all of them at once! And they can respond to the entire
group. The website address is:
