## Three Attend Retreat "On God's Time"

"It was a great spiritual experience," says Joy Schlochtermeyer, who along with Yvonne Strecker and Raechel Manley of our parish, attended a recent ACTS Retreat at the Immaculate Conception Convent in Great Bend on Sept. 10-13.

"I would recommend it to anyone, because the main thought of the retreat is to focus on the Lord, to be open and receive the Lord," Joy continued to say. "It is a wonderful time to get away and let God touch your life in a special way."

Started in San Antonio in 1987, the ACTS Retreat is provided by a team of ladies from Oklahoma, one for each retreatant attending. Beginning in Texas, the program moved up into Oklahoma and now into Kansas. There is also a retreat for men.

"It is a very private retreat," Joy commented. "There were no watches, or electronics - we were all 'On God's Time'. Sometimes you have to give up other things and make a retreat like this. Put the Lord first."

Raechel Manley shared the following, "What happens at the retreat stays at the retreat, they call it the river rule. What I can say is, if you are needing to disconnect from the world and reconnect to God and fellow Catholics, this is a great opportunity."

"It isn't a charismatic retreat, it is more Marian focused and a time to bond with other Catholic women using the example of the Mother of God."

Yvonne Strecker who attended the retreat in 2010 in Amarillo, Texas, had this to say, "I was impressed by the team leaders, leadership, guidance and support. There were so many experiences of my retreat that were very powerful. The retreat facilitates a new and deeper relationship with God, so we can become more aware of how God wants us to use our gifts."

"The importance of prayer, the sacraments, community and service is stressed. I would encourage others to make the ACTS retreat. They DESERVE it."

Yvonne did not attend the actual retreat in Great Bend recently. She was involved with the pre-retreat accommodations.

Joy shared with me this ending quote, "The Holy Spirit has all kinds of surprises for those who invite him into their hearts," as was found in the ACTS material. I am sure these three ladies would be glad to share with you.

## ***We Miss Many Things as we Rush through Life!***

Do we recognize talent in an unexpected contest? In a common-place environment, at an inappropriate hour, do we perceive beauty?

In Washington, DC, at a Metro Station, on a cold January morning in 2007, this man with a violin played six Bach pieces for about 45 minutes. During that time, approximately 2,000 people went through the station, most of them on their way to work. After 3 minutes, a middle-aged man noticed that there was a musician playing. He slowed his pace and stopped for a few seconds, and then he hurried on to meet his schedule.

About 4 minutes later: The violinist received his first dollar. A woman threw money in the hat and, without stopping, continued to walk.

At 6 minutes: A young man leaned against the wall to listen to him, then looked at his watch and started to walk again.

At 10 minutes: A 3-year old boy stopped, but his mother tugged him along hurriedly. The kid stopped to look at the

violinist again, but the mother pushed hard and the child continued to walk, turning his head the whole time. This action was repeated by several other children, but every parent – without exception – forced their children to move on quickly.

At 45 minutes: The musician played continuously. Only 6 people stopped and listened for a short while. About 20 gave money but continued to walk at their normal pace. The man collected a total of \$32.

After 1 hour: He finished playing and silence took over. No one noticed and no one applauded. There was no recognition at all.

No one knew this, but the violinist was Joshua Bell, one of the greatest musicians in the world. He played one of the most intricate pieces ever written, with a violin worth \$3.5 million dollars. Two days before, Joshua Bell sold-out a theater in Boston where the seats averaged \$200 each to sit and listen to him play the same music.

This is a true story. Joshua Bell, playing

incognito in the D. C. Metro Station, was organized by the Washington Post as part of a social experiment about perception, taste and people's priorities.

One possible conclusion reached from this experiment could be this: If we do not have a moment to listen to one of the best musician in the world, playing some of the finest music ever written, with one of the most beautiful instruments ever made . . . how many other things are we missing as we rush through life?
