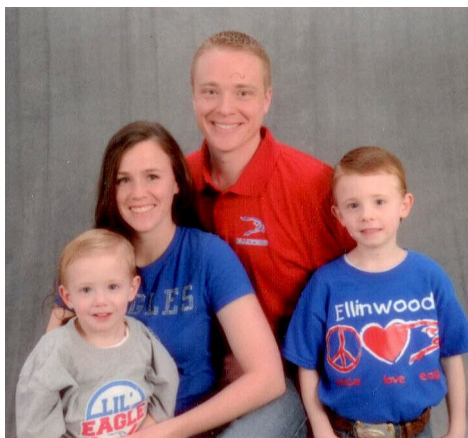

Remembering Longtime Parishioner Ruth Hill

Ruth Hill, 91, passed away on August 14. A long time member of St. Joseph Church, Ruth came to Ellinwood in 1969 from Sedgwick, Kansas.

She was born on March 4, 1925, in Allendale, Missouri, the daughter of Lester and Gladys Monday. She graduated from Lamoni High School in Lamoni, Iowa.

She met Warren Max Hill, (Max, as we know him), during their high school days in Lamoni. They were married on November 3, 1942. Max and Ruth celebrated 60 years together before his death on July 20, 2003.

Son Steve shared, "Dad was a truck driver for most of his life, working for Kaw Transport Co., so Mom raised us four boys. We were in all kind of sports and kept her pretty busy."

"She made the best homemade pizza and we were always having sports parties at our house and she would make the pizzas."

"After we were all out of high school," said Steve, "Mom joined the Catholic Church. A few years later, Dad joined too." After Dad's retirement, they both drove the Special Ed Bus.

A very active and happy person, Ruth worked as a cook for USD 355 in Ellinwood, and also in the kitchen at Woodhaven Care Center for eight years. She was a Meals on Wheels volunteer and a volunteer reader at the St. Joseph Catholic School in Ellinwood.

Ruth was a member of the St. Joseph Altar Society, Daughters of Isabella, American Legion Auxiliary and the VFW Auxiliary. Max was in the Army, in the Philippines, during the war.

She was a member of a bridge club for many years, including a bridge marathon, and loved to play cards. "Mom always kept busy," continued Steve. "She liked to do needlework and crafts and make quilt tops."

Ruth had a large collection of Angels and Thimbles. When Max and Ruth would travel to different States she would bring home a Thimble for a souvenir.

Ruth is survived by four sons, Roger (Tammie) Hill of Henderson, Colorado; Steve Hill of Ellinwood; Keith (Kaye) Hill of Sedgwick, Kansas and Warren (Arlene)

Hill of Cedaredge, Colorado. Oldest daughter, Jean Martinez, preceded her in death. There are eleven grandchildren and 22 great grandchildren, and nine great-great grandchildren.

Steve added, "Mom always said that all five of us kids were born in the same hospital in Sedgwick, Kansas, and in the same room."

Altar Society recited the rosary at the Minnis Funeral Home at 3 p.m. on August 19. Father Terrance Klein officiated at Ruth's funeral at St. Joseph Catholic Church at 2 p.m. on August 20th.

Memorials were to the church and St. Joseph's Catholic School.

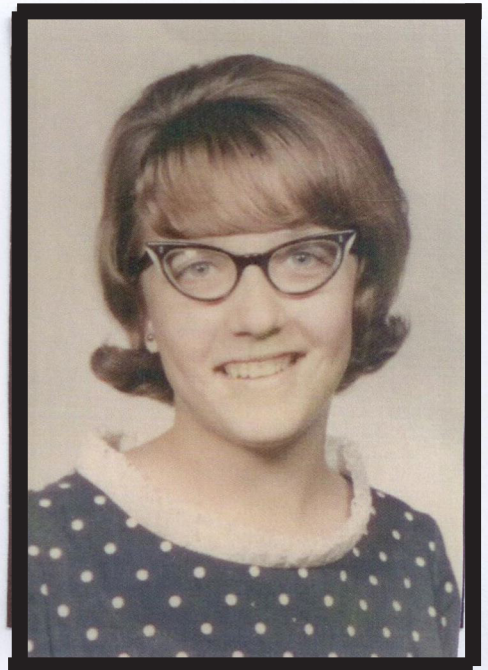
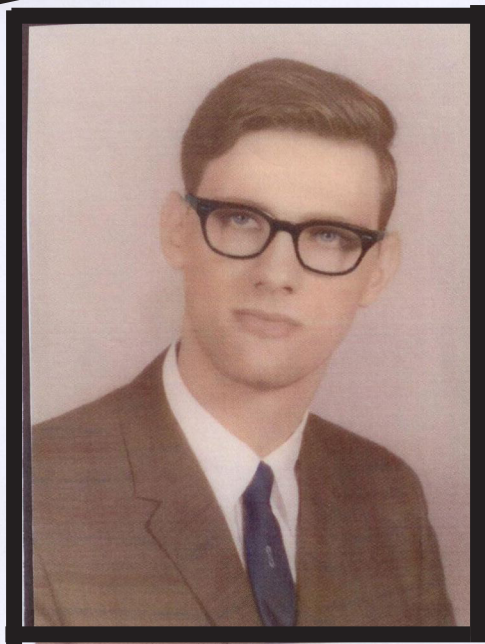
Cremation has taken place and a memorial service, with military honors, will be held in Ellinwood at a later date.

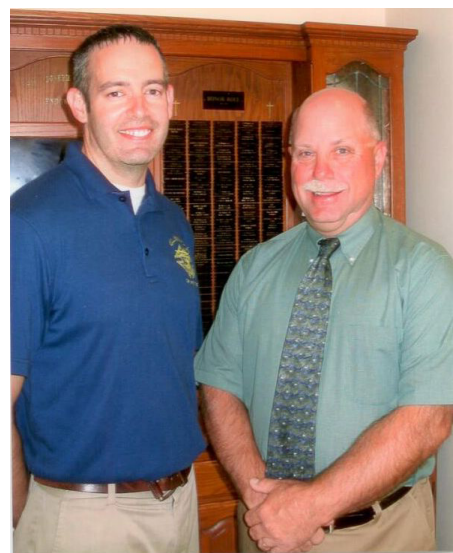
John Clayton was named Knight of the Year. John is a Past-Grand Knight for the Council and is one of the Council's most dedicated Knights.
