“Celebrating Our Lady of the Rosary in October”

On Saturday, October 7th, in 1573, Saint Pius V established the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary.

The purpose was to thank God for the victory of Christians over the Turks at Lepanto on this day, a victory attributed to the praying of the rosary. Clement XI extended the feast to the universal church in 1716.

October is the month of the Holy Rosary, so on Saturday, October 8th, in 2016, a group of St. Joseph parishioners gathered at the Blessed Mother grotto to pray the rosary together, and a prayer to Our Lady of the Rosary.

The development of the rosary has a long history. First, a practice developed of praying 150 Our Fathers in imitation of the 150 Psalms. Then there was a parallel practice of praying 150 Hail Mary's. Soon a mystery of Jesus' life was attached to each Hail Mary.

Though Mary's giving the rosary to Saint Dominic is recognized as a legend, the development of this prayer form owes much to the followers of St. Dominic.

One of them, Alan de la Roche, was known as “the apostle of the rosary”. He founded the first Confraternity of the Rosary in the 15th century. In the 16th century, the rosary was developed to its present form –with 15 mysteries, joyful, sorrowful and glorious. In 2002, Pope John Paul II added five Mysteries of Light to this devotion.

In this prayer to Our Lady of the Rosary, we ask the Virgin Mary to help us to cultivate a habit of interior prayer through the daily recitation of the rosary. This is the object of all our prayers: to arrive at the point where we can “pray without ceasing,” as St. Paul tells us to do.



Knights of Columbus Cooks Up Another Successful Breakfast

For the 40th year, the St. Joseph's K of C held its annual Pancake and Sausage Breakfast on October 9th, at the parish center.

Holding to tradition, Knights members, organized by Tony Klepper, made about 270 pounds of ground pork sausage, part of which was cooked at the breakfast and the rest was sold by the pound.

For the breakfast, all-you-can-eat pancakes went nicely with the sausage. Over the years, the amount of sausage made has decreased, as sausage sales have seemed to decline; however, many look forward to getting their K of C sausage each year, and the Council sold out of sausage relatively quickly this year.

Proceeds from the event are added to the annual Tootsie Roll Drive, and go toward supporting individuals with intellectual disabilities. Typically, the Council donates funds to the Great Bend Storm-Special Olympics and to Sunflower Diversified Services.

As an added feature of this year's Pancake and Sausage Breakfast, the Knights also held a raffle drawing for a Traeger pellet grill and four Chiefs tickets. Raffle tickets were sold for several months, and Fr. Klein drew the winning tickets at the breakfast.

Sister Teresita Visits

Dominican Sisters of Peace sent Sister Teresita to Ellinwood on the weekend of October 1st and 2nd, to share the story of their Mission Life in Nigeria. Sister, who is 98 years old, shared with us things that are taking place during their many years, working with the people in Nigeria and other countries.

Money donated is used to dig more water wells, take care of the health problems of the country, (like rickets from lack of calcium), and to find ways to raise goats, to have milk for the children. The Dominican Sisters have served these people for many years, working currently with Sister Rita. Sister Teresita herself has been to Nigeria several times.

Theology on Tap

The Catholic Church and the Nazi's was the topic of discussion by Father Terrance Klein at the October 8th meeting at the Historical Wolf Hotel.

A big group attended to hear Father's talk about what was done during this period, what should have been done and what should we learn for our future.

Finance Council Meets

On Monday, Sept. 19th, the finance council discussed the following: the need for repair of the church roof around the steeple and the west end, the need for repair to the steps that lead into the church from all doors, and the trimming of the parish trees. The council also examined a proposal for a LED sign for the church.

As everyone knows, and many have said, our sound system wasn't functioning properly. Parr Sound Systems examined the system, finding that the equalizing sound board had died.

Fortunately, when the sound system was replaced a few years ago, it came with a second sound board, which wasn't being used. Switching to the new sound board has wonderfully improved the system. Thank you to Leon Sobba and Parr Sound System.

Trees are Trimmed Recently Across Parish Property

Our parish property is one of the loveliest spots in Barton County. Trees across the property have recently been trimmed by Arensman Tree Services, the company which has serviced our parish for more than twenty years.

The last general tree trimming was in 2009. Branches were removed, either because they were dead, were too low to permit mowing, or because their growth was, or soon would, cause difficulty for another branch, or to parish properties, such as roofs, windows, or utility lines.

The cost of trimming came to \$3,750.00. The project was discounted by 25% because of our long relationship with Arensman's. We thank them for this, and would gratefully receive donations to help pay for the project.

Many of our beautiful trees are sick. Our maple and elm trees are infected with carpenter ants; our redbud and crab apple trees have wood borers; and scale and Millie bugs are affecting our elms and oaks.

The estimate to treat the trees, made by Bug Busters of Kinsley, is \$1,808.10. Good rains this summer have left our trees appearing healthier than they are.

Sadly, diseased trees don't get better on their own. They simply die, and we will need to pay for their removal. That would cost considerably more than caring for our beautiful trees.

Garrett attended Lucas-Luray School district, Ellsworth High School, and has an Associate of Applied Science in Computer Networking from Barton Community College.

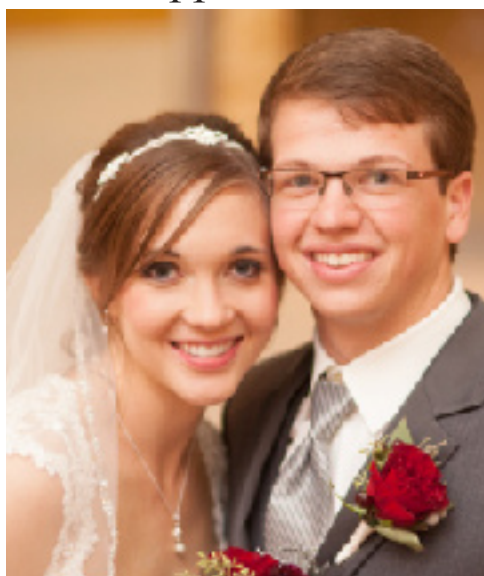

In his homily, Father Klein shared that, "Vada was a simple woman who grew up among us here in Ellinwood. She died on the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, who also lived the simplest of lives. She never married and never drove. Many times you saw Vada in her three-wheeled bicycle around town, going to the grocery store, or getting the mail." She graduated

from St. Joseph Catholic School.

Vada was a member of Altar Society, the Heritage Club and the Daughters of Isabella. Friend, Gerry Menges commented, "Vada was a faithful member of D of I, and loved coming to the meetings and socials of the group."

Many members of the Daughters of Isabella, as a group, came to the funeral bearing the banner of the organization. They recited the rosary before Mass.

"I first met Vada, who lived with her parents at the Yarmer Apartments on North Main," remarked Gerry. "The family helped us find a place to live."

Bernice Petz shared this, "When I used to say the rosary at Woodhaven, Vada never missed. She told me once that when she was younger she loved to go fishing with her Dad."
