From Bishop Brungardt and Father Klein:



Bishop Brungardt has recently written to pastors, asking them to reexamine the locking and unlocking of their churches. Some churches in the diocese are locked when services are not scheduled, the practice of most Protestant churches. But the bishop points out that "this doesn't allow for prayer before the Real Presence of Jesus in the tabernacle; prayer in our churches that have great beauty, art, and symbolism; or prayer in buildings that we, or our ancestors, gave much almsgiving, time, and talent to construct and maintain."

In this regard, the three parishes of our cluster are exemplary. Our churches are essentially open from sunrise to sunset, with minor fluctuations. However, the bishop's other concern is that, if our churches are open, this raises other issues. Is the pastor responsible for this sunrise and sunset security? What about theft, vandalism, mischief, and crime? To this end, the bishop would like to see sacristies and choir lofts locked. He has asked pastors to consult with their councils about the best choices for their parishes.

This process has begun in the cluster. In some cases, locking the sacristy can be easily done. In others, locks, or even doors (or gates) would need to be installed. Some might think, "But we've never had a problem." That's small consolation after we do. All of our sacristies contain items that would be very expensive to replace, and it's easier than ever to sell stolen items on the web. This applies to sacred

vessels and vestments as well as to electronic equipment. This past year in Claflin, the sacristy was entered and items stolen, resulting in considerable cost and care. The tabernacle had to be sent away to be rekeyed, as no key was available to unlock it.

The bishop also raised concerns about the placement of votive candles, especially if children have access to matches and other lighting devices. Again, the situations and responses will vary in the cluster. Have a concern or insight? Contact Fr. Klein, Steve Schachle, or a member of your pastoral / financial council.

Parishes can't be a parish without its people know each other and being known by those who serve the parish. This is why it is vitally important that our parish censuses be accurate. Yet a week

almost never passes without our discovering that someone, who considers their household to be a part of one of our parishes, is not listed in our census. People can move into the community and forget to register. Newly married couples do as well. Children who went away for education return, and don't realize that we still have them as a part of their parents' household.

To that end, we are inserting in the bulletin, on the back side of this letter, a parish registration form. If you're not sure that you are registered, please fill it out. You can drop in the collection, or mail it to the cluster office in Ellinwood, 214 N. Main Street. 67526. Of course, you can also register online at the cluster website. 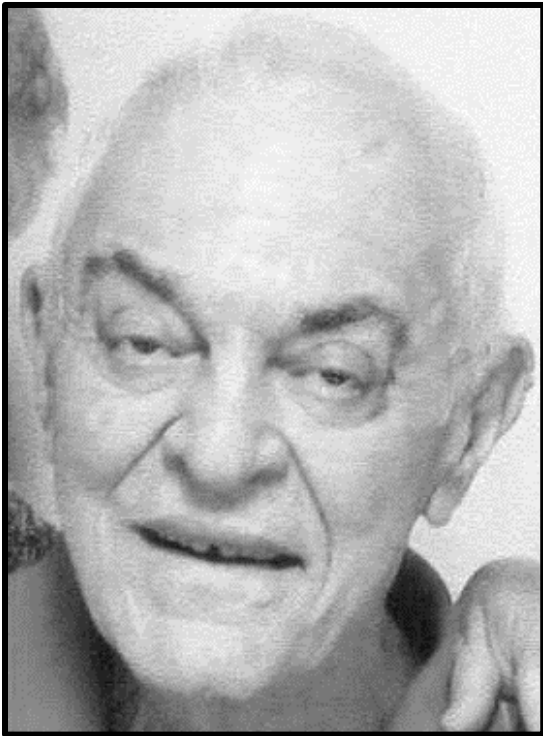

Alfred John Hammeke



1931 - 2017

Alfred John Hammeke, 86, died Sept. 1, 2017, at Ellinwood District Hospital, Ellinwood. He was born March 21, 1931, at Claflin, the son of Joseph and Mary (Heinz) Hammeke. Alfred married Linda Sue Simpson April 23, 1957, at Kansas City, Mo. A lifetime Claflin resident, Alfred was a longtime Barton County farmer. He served in the U.S. Army during the Korean War, obtaining the rank of CPL, from April 1953 to May 1955.

He belonged to Immaculate Conception Catholic Church, Claflin, Ellinwood St. Joseph Council 1187 Knights of Columbus, and the American Legion, Hoisington. Alfred enjoyed hunting, fishing, pitch, and was a self-appointed "Lord of the Bottoms." He also served as a volunteer for the Claflin police department.

Survivors include his wife, Linda Sue Hammeke, of the home; seven daughters, Kathy Hines and husband Daniel of Ellinwood, Anne Basgall and husband Alan of Hays, Margaret Frisbie and husband Richard of Claflin, Patty Sager and husband Geoff of Brighton, Colo., Loreen Leyshock and husband Brad of Littleton, Colo., Coreen Skaggs and husband Troy of Chapin, S.C., and Molly Stout and husband Richard of Littleton, Colo.; 17 grandchildren and 12 great-grandchildren. He was preceded in death by three brothers, Norman Hammeke, Rev. Gerald Hammeke and Dennis Hammeke; and one sister, Geraldine Buehler.

Mass of Christian Burial was held on Tuesday, Sept. 5, at Immaculate Conception Catholic Church, Claflin. Vigil and Rosary Service were held on Monday, Sept. 4 at the church with Father Terrence Klein officiating. Interment was at Sts. Peter and Paul Cemetery, Ellinwood, with Military Rites Conducted by Ft. Riley Honor Guard. Memorial donations were given to the Sts. Peter and Paul Historical Fund.

During the homily, Father spoke of Alfred's large stature, standing 6 feet 6 inches, weighing 250 pounds. He took pride in his gifts, from playing football, joining the Army, being a bouncer at Kimbo, to farming the land and raising his family of seven daughters. Much of their time was spent working together on the farm, hunting and fishing, and traveling to the lake in a school bus camper. Alfred also had strength in his faith, saying rosaries during lent and traveling through a snow storm to go to Mass. Alfred was surrounded by women he so dearly loved.....Immaculate Conception Church extends its deepest sympathy to the family of Alfred Hammeke.

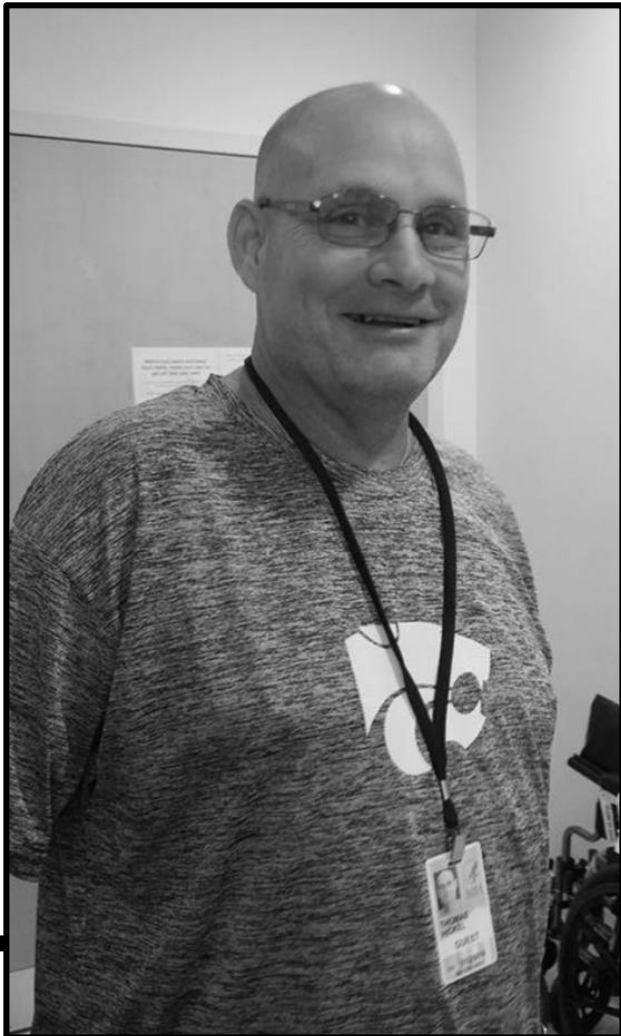

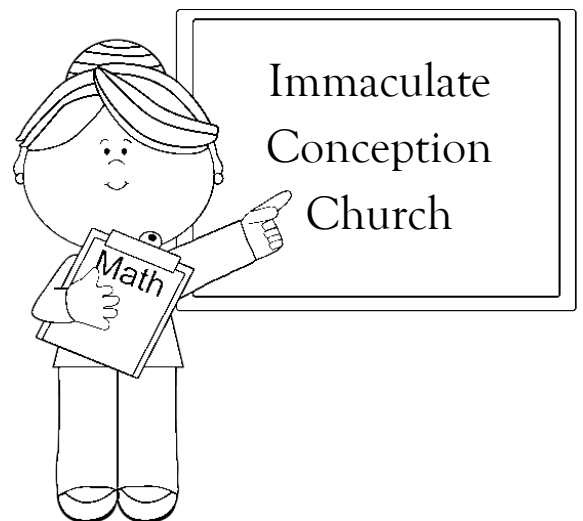
