Stand Sunday

On Sunday, November 12, churches across the United States celebrated "Stand Sunday" (also known as "Orphan Sunday") by praying for and committing to caring for children in need of family in their communities, as well as for vulnerable children all over the world. During November, Immaculate Conception Church members also supported 20 Barton County foster children when they bought Christmas gifts for them through the Angel Tree program at church. The gifts were delivered to the Great Bend St. Francis office at the end of November so that the social workers could deliver the gifts to each child before Christmas.

Statistics:

- Kansas children in foster care: about 7,000
- Barton County Children in foster care: 110
- Barton County Foster homes needed: 23
- Children in Kansas waiting to be adopted: 450

On average 10% or more of children in foster care will become orphans, aging out of the foster care system without a forever family. Statistics on foster children who age out of the foster care system (from CarePortal's partner, youthrive.org):

- Only 58% will graduate high school by age 19
- Only 3% will earn a college degree by age 25
- 1 in 4 will be involved in the justice system within 2 years
- 1 in 5 will be homeless by age 21
- 50% will experience at least one economic hardship
- 71% of females will become pregnant by age 21
- >50% will be unemployed by age 24

These statistics are heartbreaking but we the church can do something about this. Let's step in to the brokenness together and allow God to redeem HIS children. Please continue to pray for these children, their families and for foster homes!

Blessing the Community!

One of the newest ways to help those in need is through Blessing Boxes, which are popping up all over the country. Locally, these boxes are located at Zion Lutheran Church in Claflin, and at St. Peter's Lutheran Church in Holyrood. The Blessing Box ministry was started by the Zion Lutheran Church in Claflin because it was a good way for their congregation to reach out and touch lives.

Zion members Bill Stueder and Michael Stueder built the box, Patty Stueder painted it, and Alan Stueder helped Bill & Michael to put up the post and install the Blessing Box. The members of Zion want the community to know that it is available to anyone in need in the community, and everyone in the community is encouraged to place donations in the box. The church hopes others in the community and other local churches will take part. The idea behind the Blessing Box is to "Give what you can. Take what you need."

Items that the Blessing Box can hold include "Life Supplies" and nonperishable items such as grocery items, canned goods, boxed items,

paper goods, health supplies, school supplies, toothpaste, band aids, paper towels, cleaning supplies, and anything

else that you think someone else can use. Be aware that certain items would not be safe in the heat of summer or during the winter when temperatures are extreme. If temperatures inside the box reach 100 degrees, or freezes, canned goods may not be safe to eat.

If you have more items to donate than will fit in the box, the church will store those items and stock the Blessing Box as space permits. During the summer months, there may even be a container placed under the Blessing Box to accept extra garden produce.

The members of Zion Lutheran Church want to thank donors in advance for their support of the community's new Blessing Box. It is located on the north side of the church on 5th Street.

Robert A. Poppelreiter, 79, died Oct. 10, 2017, at Leisure Homestead, St. John. He was born Aug. 13, 1940, in rural Bushton, the son of Joseph and Ella (Brunin) Poppelreiter. On May 1, 1965, he married Betty Radenberg, at Holy Name Catholic Church, Bushton. They then moved to Claflin and were longtime residents there.

Robert farmed until the late 1980s and also worked for the Holyrood Coop until he retired at age 62. He was a member of Immaculate Conception Catholic Church, the Claflin Volunteer Fire Department, and a former member of the Elks Lodge in Great Bend. Robert also served in the National Guard.

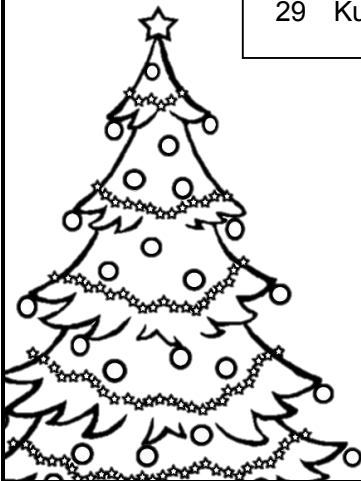
